Practice Nurse enters its 30th anniversary year as the most widely read journal for general practice nurses. The latest readership survey (PNRS 2017) puts us streets ahead of the other practice nursing titles.

We have been around since the start of practice nursing, and continue to go from strength to strength.

We have the highest average issue readership of all the journals aimed at general practice nurses, and more practice nurses read all or most issues of Practice Nurse than any other practice nursing title.

We also have the highest average online readership and the best brand reach in terms of average print or digital readership or website use and over the past 4 weeks.

Practice Nurse reaches 44% of senior practice nurses each month (AIR), 40% of our average issue readers are responsible for running clinics and 34% are nurse prescribers. More than half of our readers (51%) run cardiology (e.g. hypertension) clinics, 45% of our readers run diabetes clinics, and 43% and 44% run asthma and COPD clinics, respectively.

More Practice Nurse readers have special interests in a wider range of clinical areas than any other journal readers: between 39% and 54% are involved in everything from asthma to vaccinations, and our content reflects this breadth of interest.




